Hanukkah means "to dedicate" and is a Jewish holiday lasting 8 nights. It commemorates the rededication of the holy temple in Jerusalem after it was desecrated by the Syrians. It starts on the 25th day of the month of Kislev in the Hebrew Calendar. A special candelabra called a *Menorah* is used to recall the miracle of the candleholder that burned for 8 consecutive days with only enough olive oil to fuel the flame for one day. Also called "The festival of lights", Hanukkah is celebrated with songs, food and playing the dreidel game.
